





From The Rectory

"I am gentle and humble in heart"

What is your picture of God? An indulgent grandfatherly figure? An angry old man on a cloud throwing lightning bolts at people? It may well be that you don't have one as you don't believe in a 'god' at all. Maybe you see Nature as your god.

Few, I think, would go for the word 'humble' – but amazingly the God of the Bible has announced himself to the world as "gentle and humble in heart". It was actually Jesus who uttered these words – and just after he had made one of his most direct claims to be God:

"All things have been committed to me by my Father. No one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him." (Matthew 11:27)

Jesus is called "the Son of the Most High God", "God with us" and "the image of the invisible God" and many other similar titles. The Bible claims that he completely reveals God to us. His words are God's words, his character is God's character, his heart reveals God's heart.

In all of our recorded words of Jesus only once does he tell us about what lies in his heart. He says: "I am gentle and humble in heart".

What an amazing truth this is. God is God – all-powerful, all-knowing, all-present. But behind all that might, power and knowledge beats a gentle and humble heart. One that is loving, kind and compassionate. One that looks to the goodness and worth of others before their own greatness. This revealing of God's character comes with an invitation:

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11:28-29)

Jesus says come to me and find rest for your souls as in me you find the gentle and humble God. Listen to me and my way of life for it opens up soul-rest for you. How do we come to Jesus – we come through prayer. Prayer at its heart is an expression of an intimate two-way relationship with the God who made us. So why not try praying to Jesus? You don't need to come to church, there is a wonderful resource available called "Try Praying" (trypraying.org) – a resource to give you the opportunity to experiment with prayer for seven days.





Annual Town Assembly Meeting

The Town council will hold its annual public assembly on Thursday 25th April 2024, 7 p.m. in the Town Hall. Refreshments will be served by your Councillors commencing 6.30 p.m.. Current agenda items and guest speakers include:

North Tawton Fire Station - Richard Keast - recruitment and services from North Tawton.

North Tawton Primary School – Tara Penny – School activities and community engagement.

Devon & Cornwall Police – P.C. Wakeman – Crime statistics and community engagement.

North Tawton Miniature Railway reinstatement - Rev'd. Mark L. Hill-Tout – gauge community interest and support. Devon County Council – County Cllr. James McInnes – news from DCC.

West Devon Borough Council – Borough Cllrs. Mike Casbolt and Louise Watts – news from WDBC.

Town Council – annual Chairs report, annual finance report, Town Crier competition, Town Flag initiative, Christmas trees and lighting consortium, 7.5t weight restriction (except for access), Memorial Park replacement play equipment.

This is a meeting for the public to assemble and raise matters and is not a Council Meeting. No decisions can be taken at this meeting but matters can be referred to full council or a relevant committee.

Warm Space and Community Fridge/Larder/Freezer

The subsidised meals and warm space funding for Jens Café will end on Tuesday 2nd April. The Community fridge and larder will continue to be hosted at the Merry Go Round until further notice. We thank Jen's café for providing this much used service over the last 15 months and if there is demand and finances allow, the scheme will be relaunched Winter 2024.

Clock Tower

Works are progressing and recent enforcement triage has determined "the style of the lead work completed to the roof and indeed all of the works completed to date, the heritage officer who authorised the works, Belle Richer-Hill is quite satisfied that the works are acceptable. Whilst there is variance in appearance from that seen previously, the materials and style of the works are in her view correct and in keeping with the historic nature of the building".

Council Meeting.

Our next council meeting will be Tuesday 2nd April full council 7.30pm. Guest speaker in the public forum commencing 7 p.m. will be AMP Clean Energy who are *looking for landlords with small parcels of unused land c.25sqm close to a substation to host a Battery Box (a small low voltage energy storage unit)*.

"Energy storage is essential if we are going to get off fossil fuels because renewable energy is intermittent. The sun doesn't shine all the time and wind turbines don't spin when there's no wind. But they do generate electricity when we don't need it too and that's where energy storage comes in.

Last year Britain wasted enough wind generation to power a million homes. All because investments in, and planning approvals for electricity grid upgrades are not keeping up with the rapid growth of wind power development. Our Battery Box solution connect to the low voltage network, a less congested and local infrastructure.

We can get our projects live, doing the right thing a lot quicker than big megawatt projects. We store the energy for a local neighbourhood for when it's needed in a Battery Box."

The Council offer an open forum between 7.15 and 7.30, and 8-days' notice is required to the Clerk if you wish to speak to the Council at the open forum. If you wish to make a presentation or raise any issue with the council for a response at the following months meeting, please contact the Clerk at least 8 days before the meeting. Public period during the meeting - members of the public may make representations, answer questions and give evidence at a meeting which they are entitled to attend **in respect of the business on the agenda only.**

Please quote agenda item number where applicable. Time is limited to 2 minutes per person. In accordance with standing order 3(f), a question shall not require a response at the meeting nor start a debate on the question. The chair of the meeting may direct that a written or oral response be given.

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

If they are brave enough to say yes, the conversation immediately resembles Mastermind where your specialist subject is the mechanics of/disadvantages of/ advantages of owning an air fryer and exactly what you cook in it. If Clive Myrie ever decides that he has had enough of hosting Mastermind I will suggest husband auditions as his replacement. On a recent trip to Exeter, looking for a new laptop, he suddenly disappeared. I was just about to ask the very pleasant lady at Customer Services if she could put a call out over the tannoy when I saw him. In the air fryer aisle. Trying all the drawers. For the moment.

Anna is the Director of Exeter, Mid and East Devon Samaritans and has been a Samaritan since 2010. She had come armed with a host of facts and statistics which she wanted to share with us – regarding a topic that is, increasingly and worryingly, a feature of our daily news. Anna explained that every 10 seconds the Samaritans answer a call for help across the country [including Southern Ireland]. Currently, the organisation has 23,000 volunteers and more than 200 branches which are free to call, every day [and night] of the year – and, as a result, spends a million hours per year responding to these calls.

The Samaritans was founded in 1953 by Dr. Chad Varah, a vicar and writer-cartoonist. Throughout his career Chad had offered counselling to his parishioners but wanted to do something more specific to help people contemplating suicide and on 2nd November 1953 Chad answered the first ever call to a brand new helpline set up for this very reason. The service has undergone huge changes over the years and now provides support in prisons, schools and hospitals, where they not only give emotional support, but train others to do the same. It was clear that Anna loves her work with the Samaritans, her warmth and calm compassion was evident throughout her talk and the proof of an interesting speaker can usually be measured by the number of questions at the end. There were plenty.

Say 'cheese'. Now say 'Taw Valley'. Put them together and you have a sublime combination. What's not to like? We recently had a fabulous guided tour of our lovely local cheese factory. A detailed presentation was followed by the 'dressing up bit' and we were off. Watching Red Leicester in the making. We had a marvellous time. Please can we come again?

So. In the interests of further market research there will soon be a Questionnaire in the Post Office. About air fryers. Feel free to complete one. There may even be a prize for the best bit of advice on what to do with one. You can have a go on husband's power harrow.

News from the Moor



Hi everyone,

I hope that you are all well. The brief glimpse of Spring seems to have vanished. As I write this, it has been raining for 5 hours. Thank goodness for daffodils bringing some brightness and joy.

We have reached the end of tree management season. This was when we focus on the health of our trees and woodlands, removing any diseased or damaged trees, clearing self-set trees from areas which should be heathland and planting new trees in our wooded areas. We have been very lucky to have some lovely support from local groups to help us with this work. Chagford youth club joined us in Warcleave woods just outside Chagford to clear Holly which had crept in and was blocking light to the natural ground cover. A team of National Trust staff and volunteers from North Devon came to help us clear saplings from Piddledown Common, an area of heathland which is very important habitat for two extremely rare fritillary butterflies. Also the StOC conservation volunteers and a team of Explorer Scouts from Cheriton Bishop, Tedburn St. Mary and Bow came and helped us plant trees in the Teign Valley. Huge thanks to all of these groups for helping us care for these different habitats which will make a difference to the species making their homes there. We had a very short window to complete this work as it had to be done before 1st March when birds start nesting, so the help was much appreciated.

Speaking of nesting season (and lambing of course)..... as we head into this intensive time for nature, it is especially important for us, and our four-legged friends, to keep to the paths when out walking, riding or cycling. This then gives nature the space it needs to thrive and we might get to see interesting species. Last year I saw a Pied Flycatcher at Fingle Bridge for the first time – what a treat.

Given the weirdness of the weather, we've had to take proactive action against the effects of climate change at Lydford Gorge. Extended periods of drought followed by heavy rain have taken a toll on the thin soils and steep slopes of the gorge. It has required increasing costly interventions, in both time and money, to open safely to visitors each year. The path along the river, between Whitelady Waterfall and Pixie Glen, has suffered several significant landslips in recent years and we've made the tough decision to close this part of the route.

A new operating model started from Saturday 16th March with two beautiful feature trails, the Devil's Cauldron trail and the Waterfall trail, available for visitors. The higher path through the woodland, linking the Devil's Cauldron entrance and Waterfall entrance (renamed the Lyd link), and the path to Tucker's Pool will open as two-way routes during quieter times only as these paths are so narrow.

Visitors will still be able to enjoy the temperate rainforest as the trails to the Devils Cauldron and Whitelady waterfall both have some lovely temperate rainforest habitat. The Devil's Cauldron trail is better to see lower plants like mosses, liverworts and ferns which love the damp and shady environment there. The Waterfall trail is better to see trees and plants, especially wildflowers in spring, that thrive in the humidity created by the waterfall.



Finally, our Ranger team in the Teign Valley has new volunteer opportunities including Volunteer Ranger, Workshop Volunteer and a Trail Inspector role. If you are interested, or know of anyone who might be, the team have a drop-in event planned on Tuesday 30th April for a 'Meet the Team and Task' day. The Ranger team will be in Rectory Woods from 10 a.m. until 2 p.m. completing some footpath maintenance and woodland aftercare. 



This month's Art Box is written by Jan Gray, a creative piece based on Artemisia Gentileschi's Self Portrait as St Catherine of Alexandria in The National Gallery.

The broken wheel

Each day I look out at the faces who stand before my image. I listen to those who know of me and my work; those who on their trip here, stopped by the gift shop and bought their guide. I hear time and time again the story of my life- of how in a world where some women were often seen as simply objects or worse, not seen at all, I accomplished so much.

The gallery viewers who stop before me discuss my portrait in hushed tones. There are those who see a warrior, proud and defiant, whilst others talk of martyrdom and sainthood. Those who are curious take time to read the passage printed below the frame. My life, fixed in a short paragraph between two dates; a momentary interest sparked before passing on.

My story is one that has been told may times and by many women who, like me, were used to gratify another's lust. Although I fought back, although I survived, if you look carefully into my eyes, you will see it all reflected there.

Many will never see, knowing nothing of me. They pass by my image on their way to other rooms in the gallery to marvel at famous images by artists more famous than me. My face is not one to entice some people and my modest pose and robe holds no titillation for those seeking suchlike.

Despite this, some people do stop as they are drawn in by my gaze and, as I look on them, I hope they see the story I show to them in my pose.

How many of them see that like the wheel I hold, I was broken; made not whole, unable to function as I should. My body was raped, destroyed in a moment where power was concealed in passion and I was left powerless, unable to recapture my innocence even though I fought back with words, then paper, oil and brush.

I did survive as survival is instinctual, but as a survivor I was only half alive, anger and vengeance replacing the joy and hope of my youth.

I am not hard on those who do not see this; I have worked hard to mask my pain and fear and to

fight instead. I created a shell within which my pain lies black, and dark and waiting. You might ask for what does it wait?

To be seen and understood; it waits to be heard by those of you out there who too have this pain but a voice much louder than mine and can speak for me.

You will see. Those of you who, like me survive abuse, will see.

And from where I am captured in my portrait, our eyes will meet in a silent greeting of recognition. For that I wait, for someone to understand that despite all I achieved, despite all I created. I did this with part of me broken.



Libraries Unlimited - Home Library Service in Devon

Have you just moved into the area and would like to find some way of meeting people and helping your new community?

Or are you unable to get to the library?

Devon Libraries has a wonderful free service for readers who are unable to get to the library because of health, mobility or caring responsibilities (this could just be a temporary or long-term situation). It is called the Home Library Service, where volunteers deliver books and audiobooks to the client in their own home or care setting, then collect and return them to the library.

I have been co-ordinating this service in the Okehampton area for many years now and my team and I are always happy to see if our service will help new clients. Those interested in becoming a volunteer have an informal chat with myself and a member of staff at the library to talk through the role. There is then an application process which will include a DBS check as the role does include regular contact with vulnerable groups. Then following the volunteer application process, a prospective volunteer would have the opportunity to shadow one of my team on a Home Library visit.

Many clients are able to choose and order their own books online. But for those who are unable to do this, the Home Library volunteer will discuss client preferences with them, the genres of books and authors they like and choose items from library stock or order titles from the library catalogue for them.

One benefit of being with the service is that you can borrow books and audiobooks for six weeks at a time and there is no charge for ordering titles from Devon Libraries stock. Devon Libraries also offer a 'Good Neighbours' for friends, neighbours and family wishing to choose and deliver books to people not able to get to the library. Good Neighbours membership has various benefits ensuring library services are available to all - for more details contact your local library.

Our Home Library team is a small and friendly group and we would love to help more people, so we welcome volunteers and clients. Visits are very individual, some clients may need a visit every fortnight, some may only need a visit every few months. We liaise to suit both the client and the volunteer
