

From The Rectory

"An angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." (Matthew 1:20-21)

I've just spent an hour re-arranging my office. I am not sure if I like the new arrangement yet, but it feels a little like a fresh start, a new way to look at things. My mind is toying with the possibilities. December and January are a time of new starts. Obviously, there is the ticking over to a new year, 2026, a chance to make resolutions to change, to do next year better than the last one. To start with a fresh slate (well maybe a fresher one!).

Christmas too is the celebration of a fresh new start. With the arrival of baby Jesus, God the Son come in human flesh, everything had shifted in the universe. God had arrived in his world. God was going to live with us, taste the life of joys and hopes; suffering and pain, that we all face. He would go so far as to taste that ultimate fear that we all face: death. Christmas is wonderful because it is an announcement that God cares and God has not left us alone. But not only that, it is the beginning of something even better. Jesus came on a mission. A mission he was named after:

"... you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

Jesus came on a mission to save us from our sins – to make

Another fresh start in January is the start of building work inside St Peter's to reorder the West End of the church and provide fresh modern facilities and larger meeting spaces. Our last service in the church will be on the 4th January 2026 and we hope to reopen the church in Summer 2026. In the meantime, the plan is that our main services will take place in North Tawton primary school. Other groups who meet in the church building will be meeting elsewhere – please do ask your group leader or look out for details in the Roundabout.







Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

It's got me thinking. Devon Federation of W.I.s is putting on a writing competition. They want us to write a short story entitled 'Childhood Memories'. And it's got me thinking. And remembering. And I started to wonder about the naughtiest thing I ever did as a child. And – more importantly – the naughtiest thing that husband ever did as a child. Me first.

It feels like it could have happened only yesterday. My mum is standing at the kitchen sink, looking through the window, watching me, and wagging a finger at me as if to say 'don't you DARE do what I think you're about to do'. And I did it. I slowly started unwinding the washing line from where it was attached to one of the supporting poles. The washing line that was full of freshly washed laundry. It was never going to end well. It was all over so quickly. Suddenly, the weight of the wet washing whipped the line out of my fingers and – somehow – gravity got involved. In other words, the freshly laundered laundry – still carefully pegged to the line – was beautifully draped over the grass and assorted vegetables. At this point I was going to write 'oops' but I don't think 'oops' quite gives the situation, I then found myself in, enough impact.

Bronwen Stephens-Harding, our November speaker, started her talk with childhood memories. Having grown up surrounded by her musical family she declared, at the tender age of five, that she wanted to be an opera singer. Following years of working in corporate marketing, busking on the London Underground, choral and opera singing plus studying singing as well, she founded Rogue Opera in 2018, with the idea of sharing her passion with new audiences and finding more intimate venues for their performances. Bronwen, and her team of artistes, chose Carmen as their inaugural performance with Bronwen taking the title role and also directing the production. She loved it. This was followed by a very successful contemporary re-imagining of Don Giovanni in 2019. Then Covid arrived and everything had to change - Bronwen set up online streaming performances which involved dealing with a lot of unfamiliar technology – it was a huge relief to go back to live performances eventually but with nervous audiences she started putting on outdoor events to avoid crowded indoor venues. Apart from performing in traditional spaces, Bronwen is keen to take Rogue Opera into schools and even do pop-up performances in shopping centres and parks – any venue is a possibility!

And then – what an absolute treat and privilege it was, to see and hear Bronwen transform herself into Carmen and sing the Habanera. With the simple addition of a rose in her hair and a scarf tied around her waist, she became Carmen. Her voice, movements and facial expressions were spellbinding. But there was more to come – Bronwen sang Home Sweet Home, which was originally made famous by fellow Australian Dame Nellie Melba, a beautiful, emotional rendition. Bronwens final song was taken from the opera Orpheus and Eurydice – Che Faro Senza Euridice – which translates as What Will I Do Without Eurydice? And it was fabulous. Questions followed and Bronwen shared how she looks after her voice – lots of sleep, lots of water and minimal alcohol – she also shared a dream of singing at Carnegie Hall one day or even closing down Grand Central Station, New York [temporarily of course] and singing there. Why not??!

Did you just ask what we're doing? Well – not only are we signing up for our annual trip to Clarks village, the Theatre Royal Plymouth Panto, a tour of the Devon and Exeter Institute, our carol service at Exeter cathedral and various lunches, we are also heading down to Tavistock to raid a flapjack factory, sailing up the River Exe estuary in pursuit of wildlife and planning another Produce Show so we can show off our crafting, baking and floristry skills. And there's more – we've got woodworking skills to learn, Xmas baubles and stars to make and skittles to knock down. There's so much going on I haven't got time to sit here telling you about husband's naughtiest childhood memory but I know he would be severely disappointed if I didn't. And when he confessed it to me I looked at him and said 'you're not the man I married – if I'd known you were capable of such a deed I would never have said I do'. Let me set the scene.

He was four years old. He loved digging. He snuck into his Auntie Greta's garden and, with his bare hands, he pulled up every single cabbage plant that she had just finished planting.


Seriously. That's it. That's the naughtiest thing he ever did.

It uses the traditional technique of smocking, which is a process of pinching fabric at regular intervals to create patterns of folds.

Annie will be leading two workshops at the Community Centre, 2-4pm on 11th & 17th January, with Exeter/Berlin based artist, Sam Godfrey, who was here at the gallery for an Art Residency last October. Sam is working on a short film which will be screened at the workshops, and in the gallery window, showing archival imagery of farming smocks.
