From The Rectory

In the run up to Remembrance this year I have been thinking about forgiveness - probably because the reading we are having on Remembrance Sunday touches on this area:

Do not repay anyone evil for evil... Do not take revenge... Do not be overcome by evil but overcome evil with good. (Romans 12:17-21)

This is a call in our personal relationships to meet the evil done to us with goodness. The idea here is simple. When we respond to evil done to us 'in kind' it escalates, and we soon become overcome by evil. We've all seen it happen, a joke is taken as a slur, the slur is met with an insult, and one angry accusation follows another. The atmosphere in the room darkens, feet shuffle, the gathering comes to a quick end – no one wants to be in a room with two angry people trading insults and threats.


Paul in this passage says – instead of throwing back an insult, why not throw back something good. An apology... forgiveness... encouragement. Stop the cycle. Refuse to esca-

late evil but overcome it with good. Be the one to offer the hand of friendship.

Imposible, we might think. But God did it — that's what Jesus' death is about. God entered a world full of overwhelming evil and of cycles of revenge, and as Jesus the man absolutely refused to take revenge or payback evil with evil. He faced an unjust trial, undeserved torture, and a criminal's death because of the jealousy and fear of others... and as he faced the accumulated evil and wrongdoing of the whole world, he met it with his self-giving love, dying under the weight of it. And in that moment, he opened the door for us to be forgiven by him and to have the power to likewise forgive. Our world is ruled by a God who did not meet our human evil with evil but stepped into the world to stop the cycle through his own suffering. That gives us the inspiration and power to break the cycle of evil and revenge in our own lives through the power of forgiveness.



Here at North Tawton Town Council we are as busy as ever, with our Town Council meetings, Councillor Surgeries and day to day running of the Council. Due to the ongoing need for transparency and easier access to Town Council information, we have invested in the development of a new website. 

Ramblings of a North Tawton W.I. Member

Once upon a time it was known as 'cutting a rug'. A more modern version would be along the lines of 'throwing some shapes'. Husband could never be accused of being particularly modern but — oh my — was he throwing some shapes the other night down at the Tawland Events Old School Disco. [Never thought I'd be putting that particular phrase in our parish magazine but there's a first time for everything — even that] But there he was — disco dancing for all his might. I think he was possibly just a bit more entertaining than the 'catchy tunes' to which he was throwing his own special shapes. And he absolutely loved it. He's hoping they'll put on another one. And I think that some of the other 'movers' entertained by husband's special shapes are hoping so too. I wonder if our October speaker could be tempted to throw some shapes under a glittery disco ball.

John Gregory, Chief Executive of Gregory Distribution and the third generation in line to work for the firm, gave us a factual, statistical and extremely interesting presentation of the history, development and values of a company that is justifiably very proud of it's heritage. John's grandfather, Archibald John Gregory, started the business using a horse and cart to haul coal from North Tawton railway station to the wool factory. After the horse died, in 1919, Archie bought a Model T Ford lorry – a huge investment in many ways, and A.J. Gregory was operational. Now fast forward over a century to 2025 and the firm has gone from strength to strength operating from sites spread across England, Wales and Scotland. Archie's son, William John [Jack] was born in 1924 and in 1942 he went to work at Lloyds Bank in Tavistock however, finding it difficult to cover the costs of his lodgings with the wage paid by the bank he made the decision to join the family firm in 1947. Jack could see opportunities to expand the business and set about this by acquiring other businesses and new lorries, the 'family' firm philosophy was still an important part of the business and at one point during Jack's time at the helm there were eight fathers and sons working for the company. Following continued success and expansion of the firm Jack handed over the business to John in 1985. John could see further opportunities ahead and a couple of years into his time he made the decision to buy 36 mobile phones which, at the time, cost £24,000 – but the payoff was virtually immediate as it now meant drivers no longer needed to look for a payphone whilst on the road – and within six months the financial outlay had been repaid. Expansion continued – with the Gregory Group acquiring 15 businesses between 1985 and 2018 including Kay Transport and Framptons. The decision to create a joint venture with Hayton Coulthard in 2010 was another significant move. Fast forward again to 2019 and it was time to celebrate the company's centenary with a Royal visit from the then Prince Charles. Time for a few Gregory statistics. Out of the 3,500 employees 2380 are drivers, they have 2 million square feet of warehousing, they have 1,500 vehicles and 2430 trailers. They buy 100 million litres of fuel per year and drive 2 million miles per week getting through 10,000 tyres per year. And it all started in little ol' North Tawton.

There was a definite feeling of pride as I watched our home grown spuds being lifted. Husband could barely contain his joy. It was almost overwhelming. No need for rice or pasta in our kitchen — oh no. It'll be spuds with everything. Even on the brand new 'Home Made/Home Grown sales table that has made an appearance at our monthly meetings. We had spuds, apples, jam, onions, cute little crocheted creatures and some beautiful examples of wood turning. All home made or home grown.

Talking about home made – we had a superb visit to North Tawton's very own blacksmiths – C.H Jones and Son. At the family run business, with a history dating back to 1899, you will find Tim and his son Oliver using traditional and modern techniques in their craftsmanship. It was a real treat to watch Oliver produce a bespoke 'leaf hook' with brass highlights [have a look at their website] And three of us didn't need much encouragement to wield a hammer and have a go too – [with a lot of much needed guidance from Tim and Oliver] I'll tell you one thing -

Making a Victoria Sponge is so much easier.



Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness,
Close bosom-friend of the maturing sun;

And fill all fruit with ripeness to the core;

Who hath not seen thee oft amid thy store?
Sometimes whoever seeks abroad may find

Drowsed with the fume of poppies, while thy hook
Spares the next swath and all its twined flowers:
And sometimes like a gleaner thou dost keep

While barred clouds bloom the soft-dying day,



With Autumn setting in, things are busier than ever with Red Mud Arts.

We are supporting two new groups this winter! Self-led <u>Portrait Sessions</u> with a model 10am-1pm every third Saturday of the month starting in January (email shelley@shelleysaxonunmasked.co.uk), and free informal <u>Creative Kin Drawing Group</u> monthly on a Monday morning (email hello@emmelinewebb.com). These join our roster of other groups including <u>Open Mic Nights</u> at the White Hart, Fore Street, 7.30 every second Wednesday, <u>Critique Group</u> for artists 7pm every second Tuesday (email ruth.helen.smith@outlook.com), and <u>Life</u> <u>Drawing</u> 7-9pm every last Tuesday of the month at the Community Centre (email ruth@ruthsmithgallery.co.uk).

In addition to these regular groups, we have been planning an exciting project that will come to North Tawton in January involving workshops, a film, and a large art installation, which grew out of an art residency here last October. We're very excited to be pioneering the first ever Smocked Building Project by US artist, Annie Coggan, who will be covering Ruth Smith Gallery with smocked hessian. It will use the honeycomb technique associated with the rural English smocked frock, while the hessian nods to its traditional use covering buildings to regulate the drying times of lime render. Along with smocking a North Tawton building, Annie has collaborated with artist Sam Godfrey to make a film showing the history of smocking and its contemporary uses. Furthermore, Annie will teach a series of smocking workshops that outline the history of the craft and show the "how-to's" and "what could be's" by passing on this haptic knowledge.

This is definitely one to get in the diary! The workshops will be 10am-4pm Sunday 11th & Saturday 17th January at the Community Centre, and the art installation will be unveiled by the 16th January at Ruth Smith Gallery.

The children are now well settled into their classes and the new school year


and there is a happy buzz of learning around the school.
